April 6th - 10th	<ul> <li>Schools will notify parents when they can pick up student work at their school.</li> <li>Schools and teachers will notify parents about the type of Remote Learning model the school will use.</li> <li>Parents will be notified from their child's principal if their student has received a failing grade in one or more classes.</li> <li>Students should continue to use online programs provided by the district (iRead, iReady, Read 180, and System 44).</li> </ul>
April 13th	<ul> <li>Remote Learning begins.</li> <li>Teachers will begin providing work to students based on their school's Remote Learning Plan.</li> <li>Students should continue to use online programs provided by the district (iRead, iReady, Read 180, and System 44).</li> </ul>
April 15th	Report cards from the third nine weeks will be mailed on or before April 15th.
May 28th	• Remote Learning ends.
May 29th	• Report cards will be mailed for students who participated in Grade Repair or Credit Recovery.
