What is Section 504

Section 504 is the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Civil Rights Statue that prohibits discrimination and/or harassment on the basis of a disability/impairment in any program or activity receiving federal monies.

- Is it required to rewrite a 504 Plan at the end of every school year?
- How long does a 504 Plan last for a temporary condition (i.e. concussion)?
- When is it applicable to request SPED services for a 504 student?
- Do 504 students receiving a Class III offense require a Manifestation Evaluation (Form L)?
- If 504 symptoms/deficits exist but not at schools is it appropriate to proceed with a 504 Plan?

Commonly Asked 504 Questions with Answers

- Is the term Medical 504 Plan different from the regular 504 Plan? NO (explanation)
- Do all 504 Plans require an Determination/Eligibility Process (Form G)? NO (explanation)
- Does an amended 504 Plan require a rewrite of the existing 504 Plan within the same school year (Form O)? NO (explanation)
- Is it required to rewrite a 504 Plan at the end of every school year? Depends on type of meeting and need.
- How long does a 504 Plan last for a temporary condition (i.e. concussion)? Based upon medical information/school in a Section 504 Team meeting
- When is it applicable to request SPED services for a 504 student? When reasonable accommodations are not meeting the identified needs through documentation/assessment (Reasonable becomes Extraordinary)
- Do 504 students receiving a Class III offense require a Manifestation Evaluation (Form L)? Yes
- If 504 symptoms/deficits exist but not at schools is it appropriate to proceed with a 504 Plan? Yes

What is a 504 Plan

A legal binding document that identifies and outlines reasonable accommodations for students with a

- Permanent
- Temporary
- Episodic



Disability or impairment

How to meet the criteria of Section 504

Must have identified from a trained/professional clinician a...

- Physical or mental disability/impairment
- Substantially limits
- A major life activity

Conducting a Section 504 Meeting

Form A (Referral Form)

When conducting official Section 504 meetings **ALWAYS** use the following:

Form B (Notice of Proposed Meeting)

Form C (Parents and Guardian Procedural Safeguard)

Form D (Notice and Consent of Evaluation/Reevaluation)

Form DD (Signature Page for 504 Referral Meeting)

Form K (Acknowledgement of Receipt of Section 504 Plan)

All meetings must be held with a team of school personnel to include parent and/or guardian

504 School Liaison Duties and Responsibilities

- Before Meetings
- During Meetings
- After Meetings

Before Meeting:

(Referral/Evaluation/Re-Evaluation/504 Plan Meetings)

- Obtain Referral Form (Form A) (Referral Only)
 - A parent, guardian, teacher, administrators, school staff can refer a student when behaviors/deficits are repetitive.
 - Paper Version or Google Form (BCS website- Section 504 tab)
- Contact parent to determine meeting date/time
- Contact support teacher to determine availability and upload Form A to *Schoology*
- Send home Notice of Proposed Meeting (Form B-two attempts) and Parent/Guardian Procedural Safeguards (Form C)
- Ten days to receive Form B (If you have not received Notice within 5 days, send your second attempt on day 5)
- Once Notice has been received, select the 504 Team (this must include administrator, general ed. teacher, liaison, and/or nurse and counselor) and inform them about the 504 referral meeting, date, and time. Please have a printout of current attendance, grades, state assessments, and/or discipline

During Meeting:

(Referral/Evaluation/Re-Evaluation/504 Plan Meetings)

- Have the following forms available:
 - 1. Completed Form A (Referral Only)
 - 2. Form B
 - 3. Form C
 - 4. Form D (only check vision, hearing, classroom performance (grades), and other (classroom observation) if needed *(Referral Only)*
 - 5. Form DD (Referral Only)
- If parent gives consent, provide Parent Input (Form F) to parent/guardian (Referral Only)

After Meeting:

(Referral/Evaluation/Re-Evaluation/504 Plan Meetings)

Referral- If consent is provided, we will move forward with Section 504 Evaluation Process

- Give out Teacher Input (Form E) to core teacher (at least 2), and 1 elective
- Perform classroom observation (Form P) *only if needed
- 504 Evaluation/Eligibility meeting date will be determined during referral meeting

Eligibility-If 504 eligibility is determined, we will move forward with Section 504 Plan

504 Plan-Distribute 504 plans and obtain signatures on acknowledgment of receipt form (Form K)

ALL STUDENTS SHOULD HAVE A PORTFOLIO/FOLDER CONTAINING THE FORMS & DATA LISTED ABOVE (files should be located in school's front office and liaison's room).

504 Support Teacher Duties/ Responsibilities

(Referral/Evaluation/Re-Evaluation/504 Plan Meetings)

- Referral/Evaluation/Re-Evaluation/504 Plan Meetings
 - o 504 Support Teacher will support if you have any questions before, during, or after meetings

DURING MEETINGS

- Eligibility
 - o Responsible for Evaluation/Eligibility Determination(Form G) and Team Decision Regarding Eligibility (Form H)
- 504 Plan
 - o Responsible for 504 Plan (Form I)
 - o Responsible for Behavior Intervention Plan (Form J), if needed
 - o Responsible for Manifestation Determination (Form L), if needed
 - o Responsible for 504 Plans Additional Conference/ Plan Notes (Form O) to be amended yearly/as needed

AFTER MEETINGS

- Referral- If consent is provided, we will move forward with Section 504 Evaluation Process
 - Retrieve all data from 504 Liaison to complete Form G
- *Eligibility*-If 504 eligibility is determined, we will move forward with Section 504 Plan
 - Responsible for drafting 504 plan
- 504 Plan- Collect copy of 504 plan to file at Central Office and upload to Special Programs in PowerSchool
- Other 504 Support Teacher Duties:
 - o Progress monitoring, annual 504 reviews, 3-year evaluations
 - o Provide Professional Development for Administration and School 504 Liaison

504 is Reasonable not Extraordinary

Remember:

Section 504 Plans are legal binding documents; its primary focus is to provide anti-discriminatory practices. Therefore, a 504 Plan only provides reasonable accommodations (leveling the playing field) not specifically designed instruction (i.e. IEP).
