High-Quality Curriculum and Instruction:

Barrett Elementary provides high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

- State-approved curriculum (K-2) for foundational skills, Amplify CKLA
- Tier 3 Intervention daily using state-approved, dyslexia-specific program, SPIRE (1-5) and Sounds Sensible (K-1)
- All certified teachers provide Tier 3 intervention in classrooms, through the use of SPIRE or Sounds Sensible
- Tier 1 and Tier 2 small group instruction daily through BCS instructional frameworks
- LETRS (Science of Reading) training provided for teachers (11/12 teachers in K-3 have completed or are working on training)
- LETRS strategies used daily in classrooms
- Multisensory strategies used daily in classrooms
- Student-centered coaching cycles provided through the ARI Local Reading Specialist and the Math Coach, based on student needs
- Ongoing professional development opportunities provided for teachers through BCS, ARI Local Reading Specialist and Regional Literacy Specialist, LETRS consultant, etc.

Regular Two-Way Meaningful Communication:

Frequent Reports:

Barrett Elementary provides parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.

Barrett Elementary provides reports to parents frequently. Progress reports are sent home midway through every nine weeks. Report cards are sent home every nine weeks. Benchmark assessments are sent home three times a year; the fall, spring, and winter. The benchmark assessments identify students who could benefit from more support in different ways. Progress monitoring typically follows benchmark screening and regular assessment. When a specific area of need is pinpointed for a student and intervention is started, progress monitoring gives specific feedback about the student's progress and the effectiveness of the intervention.
