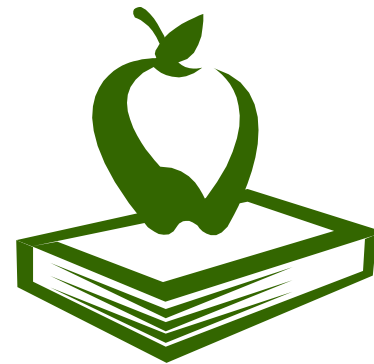

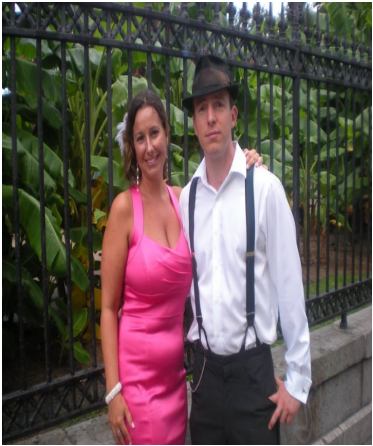


Teacher Shout-Out

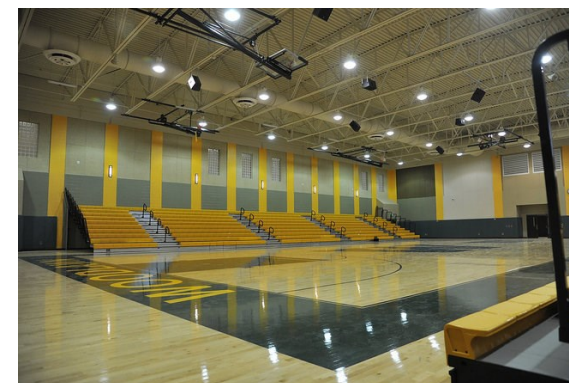
The Stampede of Paul Bryant got a hard fought win against our Woodlawn Colonels football team

Woodlawn High School's Dia de los Muertos Festival

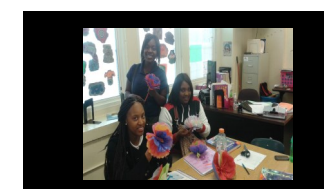
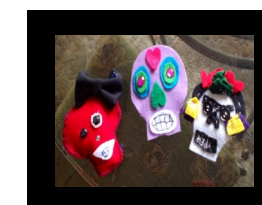
Woodlawn High School will celebrate the Dia de los Muertos as a community festival. It is the first year Woodlawn has participated in an event like this.
